Key Stage 1

• Robin Hood and The Boy Who Grew Dragons provide exciting narratives that encourage a love of storytelling.


Upper Key Stage 2

• Robin Hood and The Final Year explore themes of resilience and navigating challenges.


• To Wee or Not To Wee and The Sky encourage light-hearted exploration and wonder.
